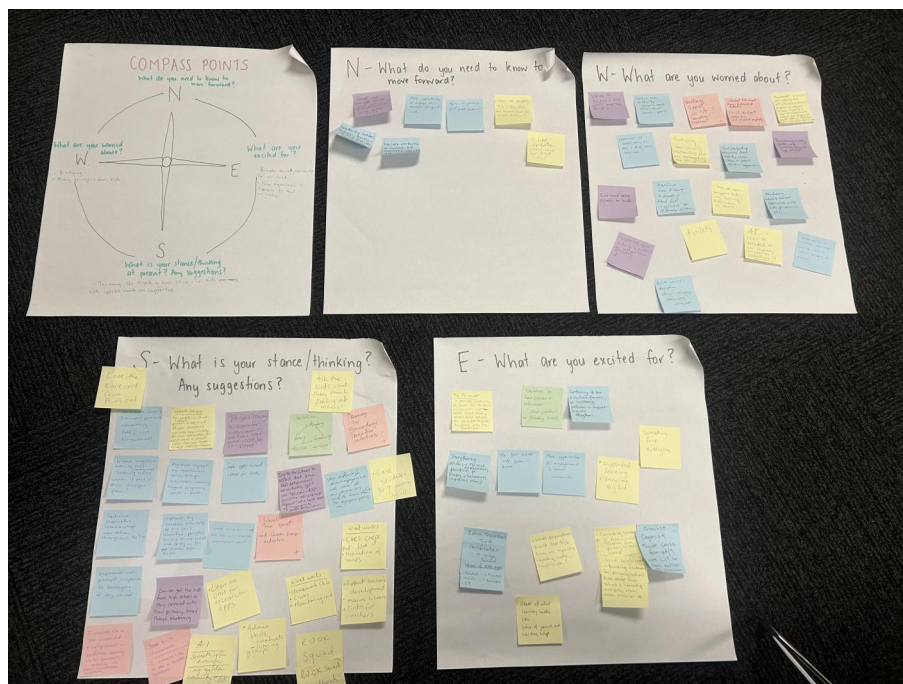

Activities Week

Basketball

Tuesday week 4 saw UCHSK send a 7/8 and 9/10 boys basketball team off to the Secondary North Boys basketball gala day. Both teams had challenging days but were competitive in each game. They both ended the day with 1 win from 4 games. The boys represented the school and its values to the highest level throughout the day and can hold their heads high.

On Tuesday week 5, UCHSK sent a 7/8 and 9/10 team to the Secondary North Girl's basketball gala day. It was a challenging day for everyone with the 7/8 narrowly missing out on a win, with all 4 games losing by under 8 points. The 9/10's showed incredible heart and resilience in every game, with a clear gap in experience being exploited by the opposition. All the girls had a great day learning lots and many are excited for next year.



Teaching and Learning

Flight simulator excursion

At the start of term, 33 enthusiastic year 8, 9 and 10 UCHSK students went on an excursion to Jetflight Simulator in Lyneham to get a sense of what it's like to fly the world's most popular commercial jet, the Boeing 737. The school board generously covered the cost for participation and students needed to apply and meet at least one of a number of criteria. This included being in the Beyond program, demonstrating an interest in aviation, or achievement in a variety of subjects including Mathematics, Science or another related elective.

On arrival students were met by their First Officer (experienced Load Master) where they were taken through their pre-flight briefing involving primary controls, instruments, and procedures necessary for take-off. They picked an airport from which to take-off and land, including locations such as London, Sydney, Honolulu, New York and San Francisco. During flight they managed airspeed, the plane's altitude, monitored for other air traffic and

completed all real-life aircraft checklists. They also had a choice of flying under a bridge, attempting an aircraft carrier touch-and-go, or performing a barrel roll – lucky passengers!

Students were also able to experience simulated free-flight using Virtual Reality on the Icaros. They picked from a range of agility, battle and exploration games where they had to fend off an alien attack, improve their high score by racing through hoops, or navigate through winding paths and tunnel.

Thank you to the School Board for making this possible and to Jen Comans and Wendy Chen for helping deliver this enrichment experience to students.

Beyond wrap-up

This year, our Beyond students have participated in a wide range of enrichment activities, both within and outside school. These opportunities have also been open to other interested students within the school, and we have really enjoyed seeing the strong enthusiasm of our students and their willingness to put their hands up for these enrichment experiences.

One of the highlights this year was UCHSK's participation in the Student Debate as a curtain raiser at the Great Debate, which is held each year at the National Library of Australia as an initiative of the Academy of the Social Sciences in Australia. This year was the first year that student debaters participated in this event, with UCHSK fielding both of the teams that debated the topic, 'Social media should be restricted to people aged 16 and older.'

As part of their participation, our students were coached by Australian Debate Champion, Professor Richard Holden. The process of preparing and presenting their debate was filmed by the Academy of Social Sciences, to be used as a school resource across Australia.

Other highlights for Beyond this year included an excursion to the Ancient Egypt Exhibition at the National Museum of Australia, success at the Tournament of Minds Competition, a strong improvement in the Ethics Olympiad, and numerous subject-specific enrichment incursions across the school.

We continue to look for ways to improve Beyond and how it is offered to our students. As a program still in its infancy (2024 marks the second year of Beyond at UCHSK), we are continuously evaluating the way this program operates. Term 4 has seen the introduction of elective Ethics Seminars, in which Beyond students nominate which Seminars they are most interested in attending. This is a different model to what has been offered previously, where Ethics Seminars have been offered by year level. We look forward to continuing to develop how our Ethics Seminars are offered so that students are best able to access this aspect of the Beyond Program.

Overall, 2024 has seen the Beyond Program continue to grow and evolve so that we can best offer our Gifted and Talented students with opportunities for Extension and Enrichment.

Breaking Through Program – Year 8 boys

During Term 4 we have been running a group program called RAGE: Renavigating Anger & Guilty Emotions. This is held every Tuesday morning and the group of boys that attend have been learning how to work in groups and how to manage their emotions. They have lots of fun and have enjoyed learning many new skills such as cooking , learning to listen and respect each other and learning how to express anger in a healthy way.

In week 7 they learnt about healthy food choices for a healthy mind and body, and they had lots of fun making fruit salad. Here are a few photos of the fun.

2025 school year equity fund is open

To ease the pressure of back-to-school costs, eligible Canberra families can apply now for 2025 Future of Education Equity Fund payments.

The Equity Fund supports eligible low-income families and independent students from preschool through year 12 with a one-off, annual payment to help cover the costs associated with schooling such as uniforms, sport equipment and activities, tuition and music lessons.

The 2025 school year payments for eligible families are \$400 (preschool), \$500 (primary school), and \$750 (high school and college).

Payments of completed applications will begin earlier than previous years, with the first payments to families expected from 6 January 2025.

Families will have until the end of November 2025 to apply for the Fund. Check your eligibility and find more information about supporting documents on the Equity Fund webpage.

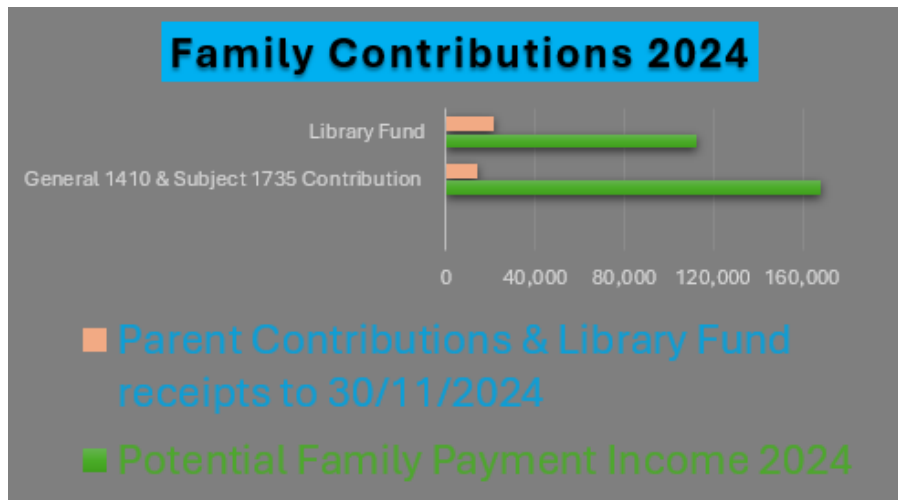
Family Contributions 2024

MyWay+ guide for primary and secondary students

MyWay+ provides the option to use a physical MyWay+ travel card or a new contactless or digital option. With MyWay+ you choose what works for you.

The wide range of payment options for bus and light rail travel include:

- **MyWay+ card** (physical travel card available at [MyWay+ retail outlets](#)).
- **MyWay+ pass** (digital ticket available within the MyWay+ app)
- **Printed ticket** (purchased through your [MyWay+ account](#) or at a [ticket vending machine](#))
- **Mastercard or Visa** (physical card or digital card stored on your smart phone or watch)

Fares remain the same with MyWay+, with fares as low as \$1.22. Primary and full time secondary students can access these reduced fares no matter how they choose to travel.

To ensure they receive the right fare, students need to always tap on and tap off with the same card or device and carry proof of concession.

Student concession expiry:

Student concessions will expire on 31 December 2025. They will then need to be renewed each year and the account holder will receive an email reminder to revalidate their concession. If the concession is not updated, the student account will revert to a standard account and the user will be charged the full adult rate for travel on public transport.
