Principal's Report



Dear Parents & Carers

As the end of semester one draws closer, students will be putting the finishing touches on many different assessment items. This may be work that is conducted in class or items that students are completing at home. There is no better time for students to check with their teachers about any outstanding work or areas they need to improve upon. Our assessment calendars are a great place to start and can be found on our website here. However, good communication is also critical if students are to achieve the best results possible. If parents/carers or students are concerned about anything, please speak to the teacher at break time, ring or email the teacher to get more information. We are determined to ensure all students achieve success, and the most effective way to do that is collaboratively.

As I have communicated in the past, one of our school priorities in 2023 is to **strengthen student wellbeing through connection to learning and increased engagement in all areas of school life.** Semester 1 2023 has seen a significant enhancement of the house system at UCHSK, with a substantial emphasis on students identifying with their school houses. Each house has a new mascot, and the PBL program and all different extracurricular areas of school life have been aligned to

houses. Put short, every positive contribution a student makes to UCHSK earns points towards their school house. 
What's happening at UC High School

The challenge is divided into four levels: Upper Primary (Years 5-6), Junior (Years 7-8), Intermediate (Years 9-10), and Senior (Years 11-12). It covers various topics, including coding concepts, algorithmic thinking, problem decomposition, pattern identification, and more.

Our school is just starting its journey in this competition, and we are proud of the four exceptional students who excelled in the Intermediate division - **Baydon W**, **Thomas Y**, **Hayden S R**, and one anonymous student. DIGITAL ARTS

Year 8 Digital Arts class are partway through a unit exploring the digital artworks of renowned artist David Hockney, and developing their own skills. This unit involves two different digital techniques, painting and collage. Students have first created a digital still life collage showcasing a particular emotion, in most cases this is happiness. Students have chosen objects that represent this emotion to them (such as favourite food, hobbies or activities). They have then digitally 'painted' these collages using Kleki, a basic digital paint tool.



Covid Smart Reminder


