## AT HOME LEARNING – Frequently asked Questions – 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition

**My child says that once they have done their two meets for the week (for any specific class), they don't have any other work to do. If this is the case, what is the 1:30 - 4:30 time scheduled for?**

How individual students choose to use the time between 1:30 and 4:30 is up to each individual family to consider. While attendance in Google Meets is not compulsory, it is strongly encouraged. Each class teacher will determine if one, or both of the allocated times on the [Class Line Rotation](#) will be used for Google Meets, depending on the needs of that subject. These will be recorded, and made available in the Google Classroom, for those students who cannot attend in person. The time after 1:30pm is set aside for students to:

- Catch up on missed work
- Do any additional study
- Respond to feedback
- Communicate with teachers
- Complete overdue tasks
- Get some exercise
- Help out around the house

**Has there been any changes to the immunisation schedule? My child was supposed to receive their second set of immunisations at school via the ACT high school immunisation program. With the uncertainty of when children will return to school, should I arrange for these via her GP, or will it be done at school once children return?**

The second round of Year 7 immunisations are scheduled for December the 8<sup>th</sup> (Wednesday Week 10, Term 4). We are hopeful that these will continue on this date. Should there be any changes to plans for immunisations, families will be informed as soon as this information comes to hand.
